Matthew 23:23	The often neglected "weightier provisions" of the Law : justice and mercy and faithfulness	So speak and so act, as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty . For judgment will be merciless to one who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment. (James 2:12-13)
John 1:17	For the Law was given through Moses ;	Grace and faith were realized through Jesus Christ.
John 7:19	Jesus to Jewish leaders: "Did not Moses give you the Law , and yet none of you carries out the Law ?"	But to this day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their heart; but whenever a man turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. (2 Corinthians 3:15-16)
John 8:3-11	Why did Jesus <u>not</u> stone the woman caught in the act of adultery since the Law of Moses commanded such judgment and condemnation?	Jesus: "You people judge according to the flesh My judgment is true" (John 8:15-16) mercy triumphs over judgment (James 2:13b; cf. Mark 3:1-5)

Acts 18:13 & 21:28	Paul was accused by the Jews in Achaia of persuading men to worship God contrary to the Law , and by the Jews in Asia as preaching to all men everywhere against our people, and the Law .	Paul admitted before Governor Felix in believing everything that is in accordance with the Law (Acts 24:14), yet he also perceived himself as <u>not</u> being myself under the Law . (I Corinthians 9:20)
Acts 28:23	Whenever Paul witnessed to Jews, he always tried to persuade them concerning Jesus, from both the Law of Moses and from the Prophets.	However, he also noted that those who sin, with or without the Law , will perish in the same way. For there is no partiality with God. (Romans 2:12 & 11)
Romans 3:19-20 & Galatians 2:16	Whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law for thru the Law comes knowledge of sin. Yet, by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight a man is not justified by works of the Law .	For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law . (Romans 3:28) Where then is boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith . (Romans 3:27)
Romans 3:21	The Law and the Prophets witnessed the righteousness of God, but His righteousness was manifested <u>apart</u> from the Law .	The ministry of Moses (the <u>old</u> covenant) was a ministry of condemnation and death which abounded in glory that <i>fades away</i> . But the ministry of the Spirit (the <u>new</u> covenant) is a ministry of righteousness which abounds in even more glory and <i>remains</i> in surpassing glory. (2 Cor 3:6-12)
Romans 3:31	Do we then nullify the Law through faith? May it never be! On the contrary, we establish the Law .	Why the Law then? the Law has become our tutor to lead us to Christ , that we may be justified by faith. (Galatians 3:19a & 24)
Romans 4:13		The promise to Abraham or to his descendants that he would be heir of the world was <u>not</u> through the Law , but through the righteousness of faith.
Romans 4:14	For if those who are of the Law are heirs, faith is made void and the promise is nullified.	For if the inheritance is based on the Law , it is no longer based on a promise; but God has granted it to Abraham by means of a promise. (Galatians 3:18)
Romans 5:20	The Law came in that the transgression might increase; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more.	For sin shall not be master over you, for you [believers in Christ] are not under the Law , but under grace. (Romans 6:14)
Romans 7:5	For while we were in the flesh, the sinful passions, which were aroused by the Law , were at work in the members of our body to bear fruit for death.	Therefore, my brethren, you also were made to die to the Law through the body of Christ that you might be joined to Christ and bear fruit for God. (Rom 7:4)
Romans 7:6		But now we have been released from the Law, having died to that by which we were bound, so that we serve in newness of the Spirit & not in oldness of the letter.
Romans 8:1		There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus .

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Romans 8:2		For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the Law of sin and of death.
Romans 8:3	For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh,	God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh,
Romans 8:4		In order that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit .
Galatians 2:21	If righteousness comes through the Law , then Christ died needlessly.	
Romans 9:31	But Israel, pursuing a law of righteousness, did not arrive at that law.	Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith (Romans 9:32), for God's righteousness has been manifested apart from the Law [of Moses]. (Romans 3:21a)
Romans 10:4		For Christ is the end of the Law for righteousness to everyone who believes.
1 Corinthians 9:21		Paul claimed that he was <u>not</u> without the law of God <i>but under the</i> law of Christ .
Ephesians 2:14-15		For He Himself [Christ] is our peace by abolishing in His flesh the enmity, which is the Law of commandments thus establishing peace [between Jew & Gentile].
Galatians 3:21 & 23	if a law had been given which was able to impart life, then righteousness would indeed have been based on the Law [of Moses] But we were kept in custody under the Law , being shut up to the faith which was later to be revealed.	Paul: For through the Law I died to the Law, that I might live to God. (Gal 2:19) that I may gain Christ, and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith. (Philippians 3:9)
Galatians 3:2 & 5		Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the Law , or by hearing with faith? Does He who provides you with the Spirit and works miracles among you, do it by works of the Law , or by hearing w/faith?
Galatians 3:12-13	The Law is <u>not</u> of faith.	Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us.
Galatians 5:18		But if you are led by the Spirit , you are <u>not</u> under the Law .
1 Timothy 1:9	The Law is not made for a righteous man, but for those who are lawless and rebellious, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane.	
Hebrews 7:11-12 & 16	Now if perfection was through the Levitical priesthood (for on the basis of it the people received the Law), what further need was there for another priest to arise according to the order of Melchizedek ?	For when the priesthood is changed of necessity there takes place a change of law also [Christ] has become such not on the basis of a law of physical requirement, but according to the power of an indestructible life.
